Key Vocabulary:

country	A country is an area of land.
continent	A continent is a large solid area of land. Earth has seven continents.
Europe	Europe is the second smallest of the world's seven continents.
landmark	A landmark is easy to see and can help a person find the way to a place near it, it is often a building of historical importance.
currency	Currency is the official money of a country.
capital city	The capital city in any country is the most important city because this is where the government runs the country from.
map	A map is a picture, chart or diagram which shows information about an area.

**Locational knowledge** -Name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans.

**Place knowledge** - understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the United Kingdom, and of a small area in a contrasting non-European country.

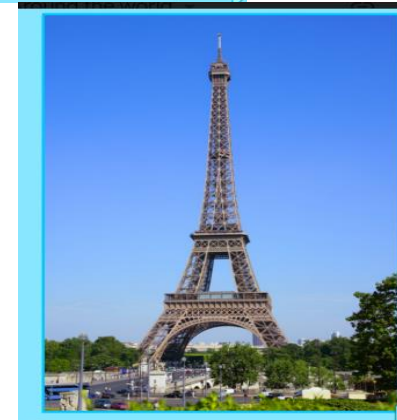
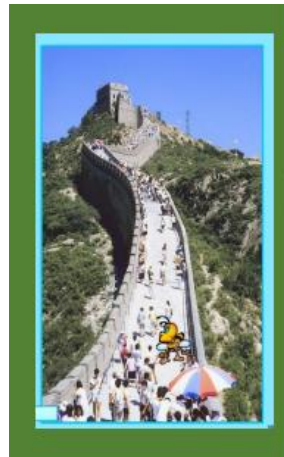
Buddy the Bee lives in the United Kingdom, which is in the continent of Europe. The countries of Europe are shown on this map.
