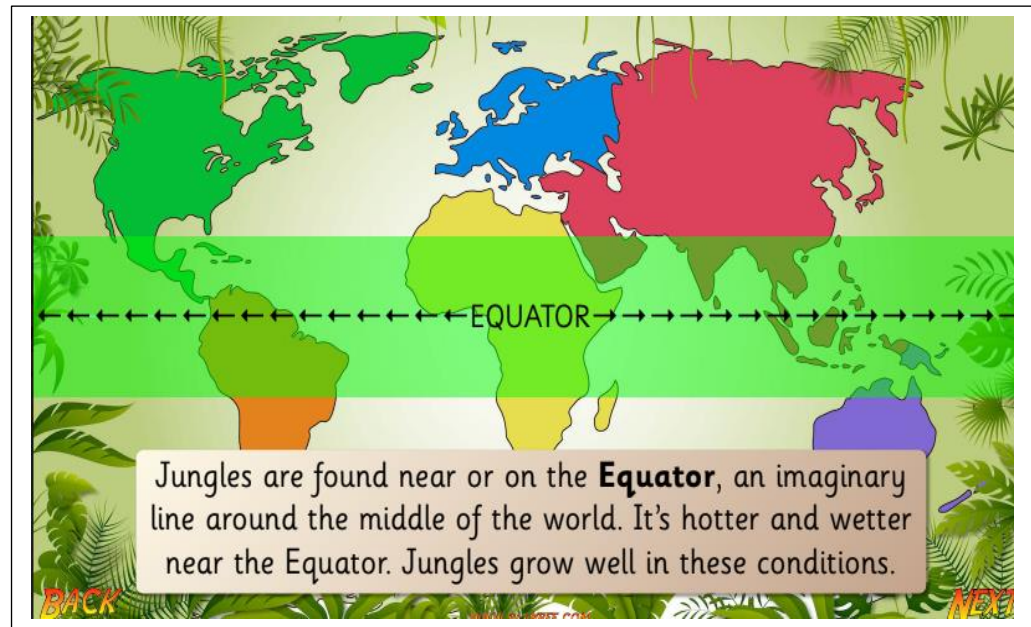

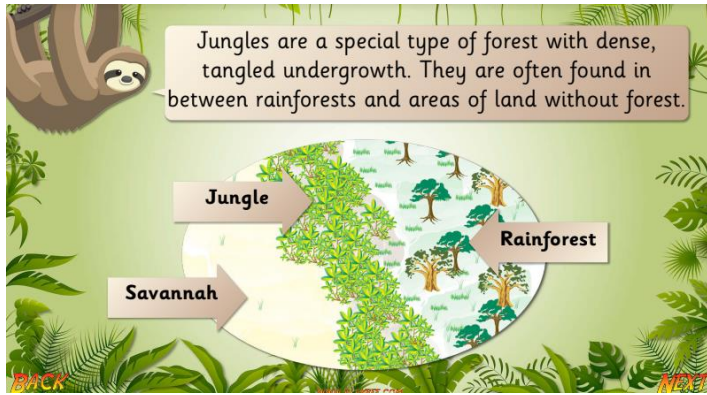
Key Vocabulary:

jungle	Jungles are forests with dense, tangled vines, grasses, tree roots, thorny bushes and other plants covering the forest floor.
vine	A plant having a long, thin, woody stem that climbs up a support or creeps along the ground.
moss	A small, green plant without flowers that grows in soft, thick clumps.
dense	Having parts very close together with little space between.
equator	An equator is an imaginary line around the middle of a planet.
coastline	A coastline or a seashore is the area where land meets the sea or ocean.
deciduous	Deciduous trees lose their leaves every year, usually during autumn.
evergreen	Evergreen trees do not lose their leaves.
woodland	Woodland is a land with lots of trees.
fieldwork	Collecting information in a natural environment.

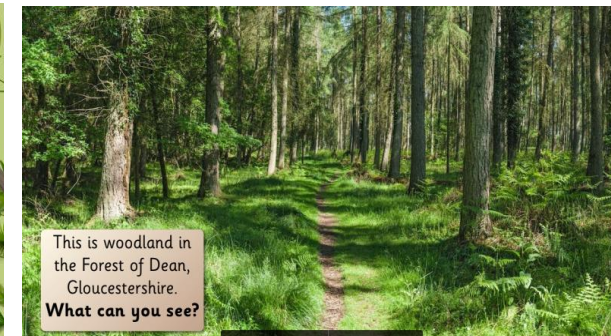
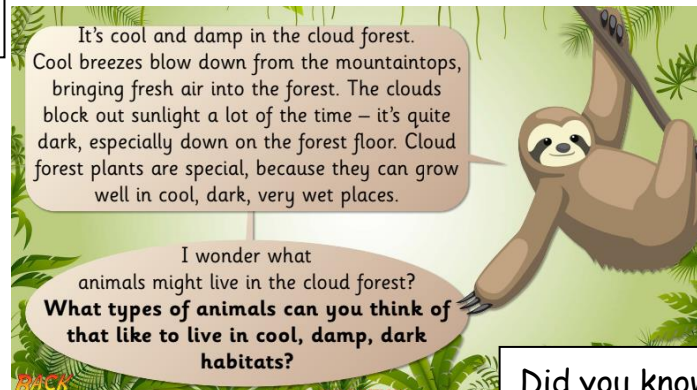
Human and physical geography - identify seasonal and daily weather patterns and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles.
