Ancient Egypt



Welcome to a new academic year and to Year 4! This newsletter provides you with the opportunity to find out all about what your child will be learning over the coming weeks, along with some ideas and suggestions for some activities you could try to support their learning at home. What are we learning during this theme?

During this half term the children will be unraveling the mysteries of Ancient Egypt. They will be studying who the Ancient Egyptians were, what life was like during Ancient Egypt, the mummification process, the Egyptian Gods and Tutankhamun. In Art they will be creating clay sculptures, taking inspiration from the greats: Thutmose. They have gymnastics and Hockey to look forward to in their PE lessons and we will be looking at the story called Red: A crayon's story by Michael Hall as part of No Outsiders.
