Walter Tull

We would like to take this opportunity to tell you all about the exciting half-term ahead. This newsletter is where you can find out all about what your child will be learning over the coming weeks, along with some ideas and suggestions for some activities you could try to support their learning at home.

What are we learning during this theme?

Our topic this half term is Walter Tull. He was a professional footballer and soldier during World War One. He had to give up his career as a footballer to help out in the war. We are learning about him as a significant person in history as he became the first black officer to lead white British soldiers into war.

As Scientists, we are exploring and comparing a range of everyday materials. We will evaluate their suitability for different purposes. As artists, we are using technology to create digital art. In Design and Technology we are designing and making a healthy Christmas snack. We will be using lots of skills such as; cutting, slicing, squeezing and grating.

In PSHE, we will be learning how to respect ourselves and others.

As part of our No Outsiders programme Year 2 will be looking at **What the Jackdaw Saw** by Julia Donaldson and Nick Sharratt. The learning intention is 'To communicate in different ways'. This looks at the different ways we can communicate with others and how to use sign language as one method of communication.

Trips, Visitors and Experiences

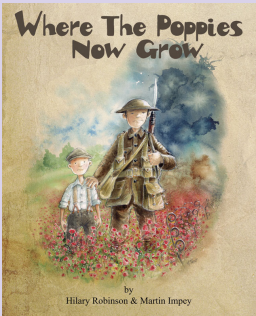
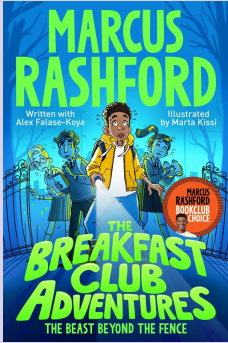
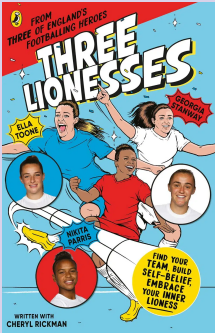
We will be taking a walk to our local memorial point on Hullbridge Road. Nearer the time, we will be asking for volunteers to join us on this walk.
