# Danger Zone!



Welcome to a new half term in Year 3! This newsletter provides you with the opportunity to find out all about what your child will be learning over the coming weeks, along with some ideas and suggestions for some activities you could try to support their learning at home. We hope that you find these newsletters informative and useful.

#### What are we learning during this theme?

Our curriculum theme this half term is 'Danger Zone!' where the children's learning will be based on naturally occurring disasters. In Geography, to link with our theme, the children will be learning about volcanoes and the effects of volcanic eruptions. In RE, we will be

looking at Christianity, focussing on the importance of The Baptism of Jesus and the Trinity. In Computing, the children will be applying their computer skills to create shapes and drawings to create a poster. The children will be developing their gymnastic and tag rugby skills in their PE lessons. The children will be creating Christmas stockings for their D&T project.


Your child could carry out some independent research, looking at different types of natural disasters that have occurred in the past and the effects these have had on the human and physical Geography of communities.
