Bright Sparks

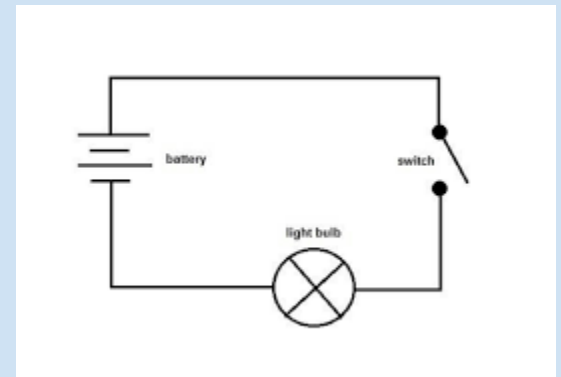

The children also have the Christmas productions to look forward to at the start of December, getting everyone into the Christmas spirit.



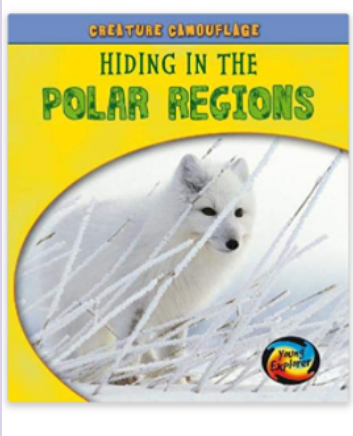
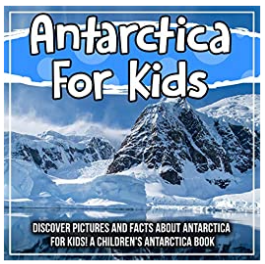
