This half term our theme is...

Hands on History

Welcome to a new academic year and to year 3. This newsletter provides you with the opportunity to find out all about what your child will be learning over the coming weeks, along with some ideas and suggestions for some activities you could try to support their learning at home. What are we learning during this theme?

Our curriculum theme this half term is 'Hands on History' where much of the children's learning will be based on the history of Hullbridge and the local area.

In Science, the children will be studying Animals including humans where we will be looking at the muscles and skeletons. In RE, we will be looking at how do people express commitment to a religion? Whilst in music, we will be learning how to write music. The children will also be developing their dance and ball skills in their PE lessons and as part of our No Outsiders programme Year 3 will be looking at **This is our House** by Micheal Rosen , the learning intention is: knowing how to support someone who feels like an outsider. 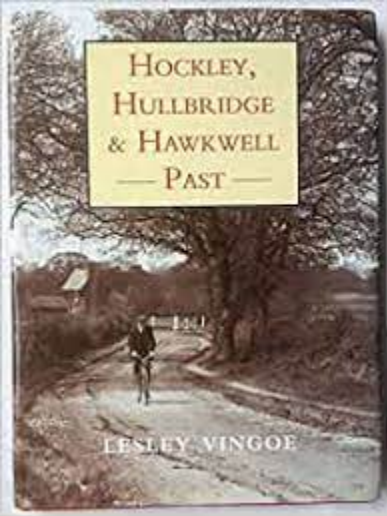
Trips, Visitors and Experiences
