Traders and Raiders

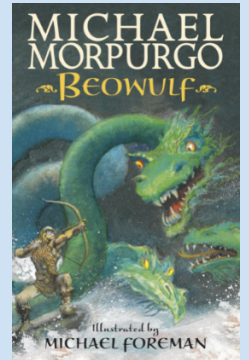


Welcome Year 5 to the Autumn Term and to our new, half-termly curriculum update newsletter!

We would like to take this opportunity to tell you all about the exciting half-term ahead. This newsletter is where you can find out all about what your child will be learning over the coming weeks, along with some ideas and suggestions for some activities you could try to support their learning at home.

What are we learning during this theme?

We are incredibly excited to kick off the new school year by taking our classes on an epic journey back in time to explore the era of traders and raiders! This half term, your child will dive deep into the fascinating history of the Anglo-Saxon and Viking kingdoms, learning about their conquests, beliefs, and daily lives. Together, we will gather evidence to answer our big question: "Were the Vikings great explorers or vicious raiders?" To bring this era to life, our class reader will be Michael Morpurgo's thrilling retelling of *Beowulf*, a classic legend rooted deep in Anglo-Saxon lore.



Beyond history, the children have a wonderful variety of learning experiences ahead of them. In Art and Design, they will take inspiration from the historic Bayeux Tapestry to create their own textile pieces using a variety of traditional stitches. For PE, the children will be heading to the pool for swimming lessons to build confidence and essential water skills. Meanwhile, we are launching Computing with a Digital Foundations unit, which is specifically crafted to give students a robust framework of skills for the digital journey ahead.

We are also expanding our language and personal development skills with some fantastic new topics. In French, we are diving straight into *La phonétique* to help the children build confidence with phonics and pronunciation. In PSHE, our lessons will focus on friendships, stereotypes and bullying. Alongside this, our *No Outsiders* curriculum will feature Kenny Lives With Erica and Martine by Olly Pike, helping students consider the consequences of their actions and that they have choices in their behaviour.
